Learning Objectives

- I can identify different safety drills that are important for home and school. (3.1I)
- I can demonstrate proper behavior during safety drills at school. (3.2I)
- I can practice disaster-preparedness procedures at home and at school. (3.3I)

Teacher Notes

- Vocabulary
 - Fire Drill - A practice of the emergency procedures to be used in case of fire.
 - Lockdown Drill - A set of procedures designed to have the occupants in a building familiarize themselves with ways to protect themselves against a threat, such as an armed intruder.
 - Tornado Drill - A procedure of practicing to take cover in a specified location in the event that a tornado strikes an area.
 - Earthquake Drill - A procedure for people in homes, schools, and organizations to practice what to do during earthquakes, and to improve preparedness.
- Make sure students know this is a drill and you will learn ways to be safe in your own home.
- Students need to be aware of your surroundings
- Scenarios
 - The smoke alarm goes off
 - You hear the door and the doorknob making sounds
 - The sky is getting dark and the wind is very strong
 - The ground is shaking

Step 1 Introduction

- Students are asked to know all exits in their house.

Step 2 Activity

- Students will create skits to come up with emergency action plans. They can ask for help from the teacher to guide them in making their skit.
